- Classical Traditions, Major Religions & Giant Empires (Unit 3) - Greece, Rome Belief systems, etc.
- Expanding Zones of Exchange & Encounter (Unit 4) - Buddhism, Christianity, Islam, etc.
- Political & Economic Societies Expand (Unit 5) - Medieval, Black Plague, Crusades, etc.
- Global Expansion & Encounter (Unit 6) - Renaissance, etc.

- International government (Unit 1) - government terms, types of governments, basic philosophy of governments
- United States Government (Unit 2) - Constitution, Branches, How a bill becomes a law
